Many lawns may be looking patchy after the hot, dry Summer, and it's now the perfect opportunity to fill these sparse areas with wildflowers. A wildflower lawn reduces maintenance too, and as many wildflowers will tolerate dry conditions, it's a win win situation to make changes to your lawn for next year.

## Planting bulbs for Spring: Camassia bulbs available now

---

In Spring 2023 we will again have our potted native bulbs to buy online. A choice from Wild daffodils, to English Bluebells, Snowdrops and more.

In the meantime we have ready potted Camassia bulbs available. Although not native to the UK, they are an ideal addition to a wildlife garden and complement wildflower planting very well.

The flowers are loved by bees and are also popular to customers at The Blooming Wild Nursery. Our bulbs are well established in 2 litre pots, with good root systems and are ready to plant outdoors.

In their native habitat of North America, Camassias can be found on a woodland edge or in a damp meadow, being happy in sun or part shade. In the garden, the tall stems look fantastic in a naturalistic border, on a pond edge or as a highlight in a lightly shaded area.

Available as white or blue, so take a look and try something new!
